Regional Fairs

Regional fairs are held in late February and throughout March. Dates will be posted on the <u>IJAS Website</u> as they are finalized. Registration for ALL Regional Fairs will be open on January 1, 2026 and will be due by February 15, 2026.

State Exposition

The 2026 IJAS State Exposition will be held on April 24-25, 2026, at Southern Illinois University (SIU) in Carbondale. While the schedule is not finalized, I can share that we will be following the framework from last year, with poster session judging occurring Friday & Saturday, and Paper Session occurring on Saturday. Back by popular demand – the "SIU Pizza Party" will return Friday following the poster session, as well as "Afternoon at the Rec" on Saturday at 12 Noon. Tickets to these events (and others) will be available on the IJAS website in January.

Membership

Registration is now open on the IJAS website, and the deadline to register is December 31, 2025. Late fees will apply beginning January 1, 2026. If your school was a member last year, an invoice will be sent for this year's membership dues. Membership is required to compete in any regional, state, or national competition associated with IJAS.

For now, one of the potential projects is to host exhibitions at different schools to showcase the works of IJAS students with the hope that those works will inspire students to participate in the IJAS State Exposition. Another plan is to utilize social media by asking IJAS student participants to repost IJAS news on their social media platforms. Lastly, Issa plans to rely on words of mouth by eliciting the help of IJAS student participants to talk to anyone they know about IJAS. "It would definitely be helpful to kind of just spread information about what IJAS is and to reach more people," said Issa.

With the help of everyone and the relentless effort of the Outreach Committee, Issa has high hopes of seeing more students from the underrepresented groups at the IJAS State Exposition. He also encourages students who have ideas or questions about the outreach program to email him or other committee members.


